SYNOPSIS

"Chinese Kung-fu originates from the Shaolin Temple"

Monks of the Shaolin Temple in central China are renowned for their unique skills of martial-arts.

The wall-paintings in the Temple vivify the legend of the thirteen stick monks who saved the Teng Emperor.

Centuries after, the Song Emperor, who was addict of Kung-fu, passed by the Temple once before lie was crowned. He observed the wall-paintings closely and writes a book on the ways of Shaolin Kung-fu. The manuscript is the treasure of this greatest mystique in china.
